Worth Dying For

History is replete with accounts of men and women fighting and giving up their lives for their beliefs. Regardless where one searches, the following are almost assuredly on the list of the most important revolutions in world history:

1) The October Revolution – also known as the Great October Socialist Revolution, this 1917 political revolt in Russia led the Bolsheviks to power and eventually led to the rise of the Soviet Union.

2) The French Revolution – 1789-99 was a period of radical social and political upheaval in France as well as throughout Europe. This sparked the collapse of the absolute monarchy in France and brought about Europe under Napoleon Bonaparte. The growth of liberal democracies, secularism and many other modern ideologies find their roots in this revolution.

3) The American Revolution – Undoubtedly the most significant to you and me was America's colonial revolt between 1765 and 1783. The Americans in the thirteen colonies won independence from Great Britain, becoming the United States of America. The American Revolution initiated the creation of a representative government responsible to the will of the people.

These events and others like them were earth-shattering and world-changing. History, from these points forward, is altered due to

their impact. Men and women laid down their lives to implement changes in their culture and in the world. The ideals championed were worth fighting for – worth dying for.

Yet, we've left one out, haven't we? There was a revolution of sorts during approximately the years 34-36 which had more impact than any before or since. Jesus Christ began a revolution against sin and worldliness – a movement *toward* holiness and righteousness – which continues to this very day. It's a movement worth fighting for – worth giving up our very lives. In fact Paul says, in Gal 2:20, *"I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in*
