Strengthening One Another

How many of you have heard of Emlen Tunnel? My guess is that probably only New York Giants' football fanatics know this guy's name, though he is in the National Football League Hall of Fame. Tunnel was raised in an integrated neighborhood in Philadelphia and attended the University of Toledo and then Iowa. He was not drafted by the Giants, in fact, in 1948 he hitchhiked his way to New York arriving with only \$1.50 in his pocket and asked to meet with the Giants owner; he was given a tryout and obviously he made the team. Did I mention that Tunnel was the first black player to sign with the Giants in a time when only one other team was integrated (L.A. Rams)? He played his last game over fifty years ago, but before retiring became the second all-time leader in pass interceptions with 79 to his credit. The interception numbers are especially impressive when you consider the teams back then only passed 25 times in a game. He was known as the "Gremlin" and the "Offence on Defense," by that he didn't just stop the other team, he made big plays that turned games around, and brought himself into the game rather than waiting for the game to come to him.

Emlen Tunnel was the first black player voted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1957. He was also the first defensive specialist elected to the Hall of Fame, the first African American to be a scout and the first African American on a coaching staff. Pretty impressive to say the least.

His accomplishments were impressive, but not nearly as impressive as is atti-

tude and how he approached the game. Inside a dark corner of the New York Giants football locker room facilities today is an almost unnoticed plaque with an inscription that every Giants player has read at one time or another. It cites an important credo that describes winners and losers. Now, as anyone who follows any sports team knows, there are winning seasons and there are losing seasons. His words were, ***"Losers assemble in little groups and complain about the coaches and players in other little groups, but winners assemble as a team."***

What is true of sports teams is also true of congregations. The truth is for almost all congregations, there up times as well as

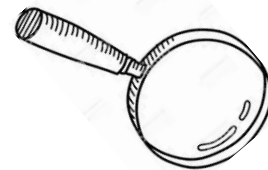
